Setting: Classroom

General Expectation: Personal Responsibility

Specific Rules: Monitor Voice Level

Listen to others Follow Instructions

Be Patient

Respect school and other's property

Take turns speaking Use appropriate language

Problem Behavior	Replacement Behavior
Loud or inappropriate conversations	Quiet and on-topic conversations
Writing or carving on school property	Respect school property and use appropriately
Chromebook not present or charged	Chromebook is charged and charger is present
Speaking out of turn	Waiting to be called on
Student uses profanity	Use of appropriate language
Disorganization and continuous missing assignments	Student keeps track of assignments and turns them in on time
Not Following instructions	Listen, Review, Repeat instructions
Student is not wearing mask	Student wears mask correctly without being reminded.

- 1. State the rule being broken.
- 2. Model the expected/replacement behavior
- 3. Ask the student to demonstrate the expected behavior
- 4. Provide feedback.
 - Praise the student in front of others or individually. Give school reward.
 - Correction: Re-teach the expected behavior if necessary

General Expectation: Respectful

Specific Rules: Check your dress code before entering school grounds & class.

Be on time.

Quietly take a seat.

Use bathroom only during appropriate times. Be open minded and use inclusive language.

Student is using phone during instructional	Place cell phone in designated chart or
time	away in backpack
Targeting other students with different	Refrain from negative comments and learn
points of view	to use inclusive language
Student continues outside conversation	Student quietly takes a seat and gets
into class time	prepared

Specific Rules: Do your own work

Refrain from copying work or plagiarizing

General Expectation: Respectful

Specific Rules: Be considerate of school property

Use appropriate language Be respectful to others

Keep hands, feet, and objects to yourself

Have regard for one another

Clean up after you eat

Student sends or shares inappropriate text	Student understands legal consequences

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Setting: Outside Area (Recess/Break)

General Expectation: Personal Responsibility

Specific Rules: Return to class, bring materials and be prepared to learn

Play without physical contact

Be sure to drink water and use the bathroom before the bell

begins

Accept consequences in a respectful manner

Continue to use academic language Finish Meals before class time begins

Students arrive on time to receive their meals

Problem Behavior	Replacement Behavior
Student walks into class eating his food	Student eats his food during the designated lunch time
Student ignores direction from teachers/staff and walks away	Student listens to teacher/staff and accepts direction
Student enters class and immediately asks to use the bathroom	Student uses the bathroom during break or lunch

General Expectation: Diversity

Specific Rules: Communicate appropriately with others

Respect and appreciate the differences of others

Be a supportive friend

Avoid possible verbal arguments

Be a good example Avoid derogatory terms

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Setting: Bus

General Expectation: Respectful

Specific Rules: Follow bus rules
Student does not eat on the bus
Be a positive role model towards younger students
Listen to the bus driver when they speak to you

Student wears soatbelt at all times

Student wears seatbelt at all times Student keeps hands to themselves

Student is caught not wearing a seatbelt	Student keeps seatbelt on
Student is flicking another student's ear	Student keeps their hands to themselves
Student is showing disrespect towards the	Student follows direction in a positive

Student is caught eating chips on the bus	Student keeps their food in their bag packs
Student uses profanity around a younger	Student refrains from using inappropriate
student	language

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Setting: Hallways & Walkways
General Expectation: Respectful

Specific Rules:

Walk calmly and quietly in hallways and walkways Be a positive role model towards other students Student keeps hands to themselves

Problem Behavior	Replacement Behavior
Student yells or shouts in the hallway.	Student walks calmly and quietly.
Student kicks or hits others with self or objects (backpack, ball, etc.)	Students will keep their hands and feet and personal belongings to themselves.
Student runs, skips, or walks unsafely	Student will walk safely in hallway and walkways
Student bounces playground equipment in hallway.	Student holds all equipment when walking in the hallways or walkways
Student yells or shouts in the hallway.	Student walks calmly and quietly.
